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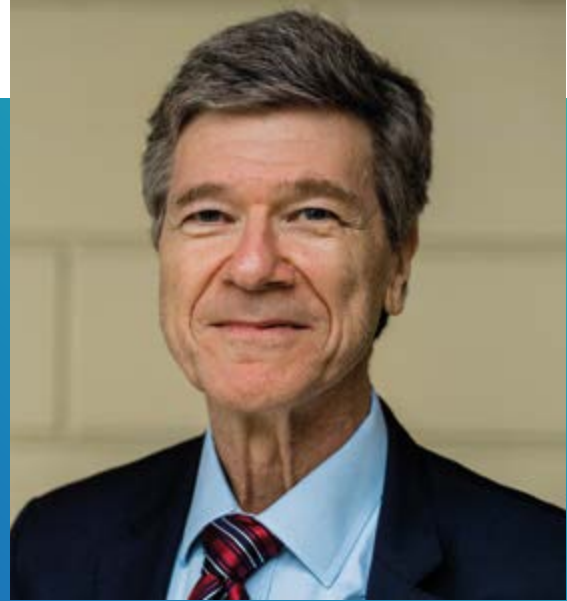
Transforming the World, One Connection at a Time

As the world hurtles towards the midpoint between the UN's founding in 1945 and 2100, the UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN) is doubling down on its efforts to accelerate progress towards the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). With its global network of almost 2,000 member organizations from 148 countries, as well as 57 national and regional networks, SDSN is poised to tackle the world's most pressing challenges with science-based solutions.

In this critical moment, SDSN is committed to mobilizing the knowledge community for action on the SDGs and the Paris Agreement, empowering societies through free online education, translating scientific evidence into solutions, and catalyzing evidence-based policy action for critical thematic and geographic priorities. Our global network of experts and practitioners is working tirelessly to bridge the gaps between science, policy, and development practice and to maximize SDG achievements at all levels - global, regional, national, and local. To achieve this vision, SDSN collaborates with a diverse range of partners, including UN agencies, multilateral financing institutions, the private sector, governments, academia, and civil society. Together, we promote independent monitoring and accountability for sustainable development.

This year's report highlights the remarkable achievements of our national and regional networks since 2022. Our Networks in Action report showcases the impact of SDSN's global network of problem solvers and their contributions to addressing the world's most pressing problems.

Enhancing Collaboration and Knowledge Sharing: The Annual Meeting of SDSN Network Managers

In April 2024, SDSN Network Managers from around the world convened for the annual Network Managers Workshop, hosted in a hybrid format across the organization's offices in Paris, Kigali, and Kuala Lumpur. The 2024 workshop focused on enhancing member engagement, fostering diverse and impactful communication strategies, advancing regional collaboration, and building partnerships.

The workshop brought together over 65 managers representing more than 50 [national and regional networks](#). Participants exchanged experiences and resources, deepening their connections and collaboration.

Discussions were held on effective network management, and included topics such as balancing priorities between host institutions and networks, as well as the benefits of granting more decision-making power to local members, which can empower diverse participants and improve program offerings.

SDSN President Professor Jeffrey Sachs offered insightful remarks on current global conflicts, which have diverted political and media attention away from sustainable development. Despite ongoing crises, Professor Sachs encouraged SDSN networks to remain focused and optimistic of the 2030 Agenda. Upcoming multilateral events such as the



Summit of the Future, COP29, and the World Social Forum all have the potential to strengthen global cooperation.

The 2024 Networks Managers Workshop fostered a collaborative environment where managers could share insights, experiences, and strategies. The hybrid format of the workshop facilitated dynamic professional and informal exchanges, reinforcing the importance of active dialogue and knowledge sharing.

Higher Education's Central Role in Achieving the SDGs

SDSN hosted its 2nd University Presidents Meetings (UPM) series in May 2024, convening academic executive leadership to brainstorm, compare experiences, and present SDG-related accomplishments to peer institutions. Over 300 University Presidents from more than 100 countries participated, alongside UN and government representatives, and SDSN chairs and managers to discuss how universities can contribute to the SDGs and the Paris Climate Agreement.

The universities that attended the meetings continue to pave the path for advancing the SDGs, including by introducing new teaching and research programs; instituting new university-wide SDG initiatives; re-engineering campuses to eliminate greenhouse gas emissions; and convening governments, business, and civil society to find solutions to the most pressing SDG challenges. The initiatives shared by University Presidents spanned from an [SDG Study Scheme](#) that enables students to integrate their academic learning with life experiences and community engagement, to the [Teacher Training Program for Ethnic Diversity](#), which enables *quilombolas* and indigenous peoples to work at schools in their territories.

To boost their efforts, SDSN provides resources and support to universities, helping them connect globally, enhance curricula, and engage in sustainable development projects. Some of these include:

Universities Commit to Accelerating Progress Towards a Sustainable Future

Based on the UPM meetings, SDSN and its university members developed a statement in support of the Summit of the Future. In this statement, university leaders pledge to do their part in the following areas:

- Develop new education programs, including degree programs and professional certification programs, to train students in the central challenges of sustainable development, including effective climate action;
- Promote interdisciplinary education and research to identify solutions to the central challenges of sustainable development;
- Work closely with governments at all levels – local, sub-national, national, and regional – to devise new, bold, and science-based strategies to achieve the SDGs in all of their dimensions: economic well-being, social inclusion, environmental sustainability, and global peace and cooperation;
- Work closely with the business community and entrepreneurs to incubate new start-ups that can advance technological solutions for the national economy and the SDGs;
- Work with indigenous peoples to mobilize their knowledge systems, expertise, and world views in fashioning approaches to education, research, and policy-making;
- Strive to make university campuses fully sustainable, shifting to renewable energy, circular economy, resource efficiency, and the protection of biodiversity;
- Utilize the new online technologies to expand the delivery of quality education and to enable greater access in the population, while also enhancing on-site education on university campuses;
- Partner with universities across the world, through the UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network and via other collaborations and networks, promoting exchanges of faculty and students, joint programs, innovative curricula, open science, and practical support as helpful for universities in resource-scarce settings.
- Promote innovation and technology transfer, including green technologies to enhance the prospects of a successful transition to net-zero energy systems;
- Work closely with governments and SDSN to boost research outputs in emerging and developing economies.
- Work closely with SDSN to develop student programs to foster peace and appreciation of cultural diversity, and enhance conflict prevention and resolution at a time of heightened geopolitical tensions.

Each Regional/National Youth Network is embedded into its corresponding SDSN Network, focusing on mobilizing young people towards achieving the SDGs. 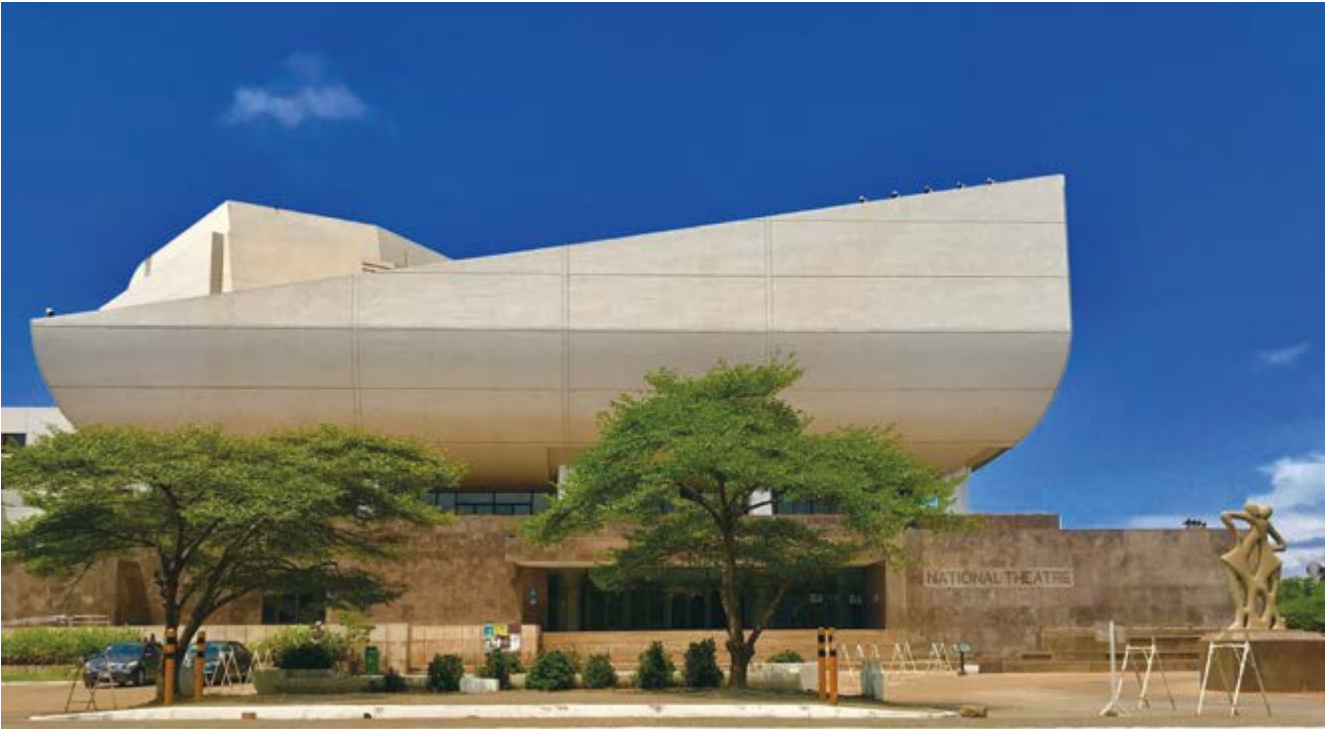

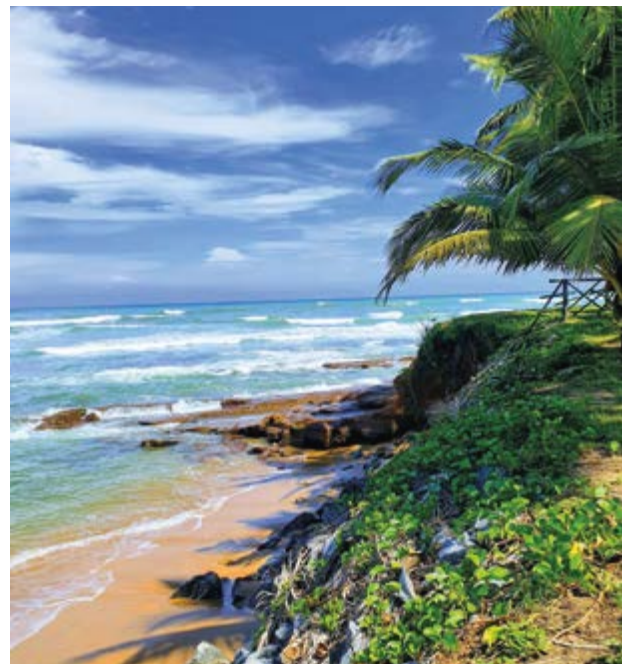
ENGAGEMENT WITH KNOWLEDGE INSTITUTIONS

EDUCATION FOR THE SDGs

SDSN Great Lakes, in collaboration with the College of Education, hosted the 1st International Conference for Re-shaping Education for Sustainable Development. Its theme was “Re-thinking Holistic Education for the Fourth Industrial Revolution” and included 16 thematic areas. Held in March 2023, the event was attended by over 300 researchers, scholars, academicians, educational practitioners, policy-makers and postgraduate students, at the Kigali Conference and Exhibition Village (KCEV).

SDG LOCALIZATION

In collaboration with the Kenyan County (local) Governments, SDSN Kenya organized two major workshops on SDGs localization and awareness in November 2022 through the NOREB & SEKEB economic blocs. The workshops targeted key county government officers and members of the county assembly. A total of over 60 participants drawn from 15 counties were made aware of and trained on integrating the SDGs and the Paris Agreement into the County Integrated Development Plans, Budgets and programs with strategies for efficient implementation.

At least ten SDSN Kenya member institutions of higher learning and four NGOs attended the 1st SDSN Kenya Annual Members Summit in December 2022.



PARTICIPATION IN SDSN INITIATIVES

In Collaboration with the Food, Environment and Land Development (FELD) Catalyst program at SDSN Paris and SDSN Global, SDSN Kenya organized a collaborative workshop and platform for practical solutions and policy engagement on September 7, 2023. Held during the 2023 Africa Climate Summit and Week at University of Nairobi, it brought together over 90 delegates and multi-level stakeholders from government, academia, and civil society. The diverse discussions were geared towards propelling sustainable development, climate action, and food security in Kenya and the continent.

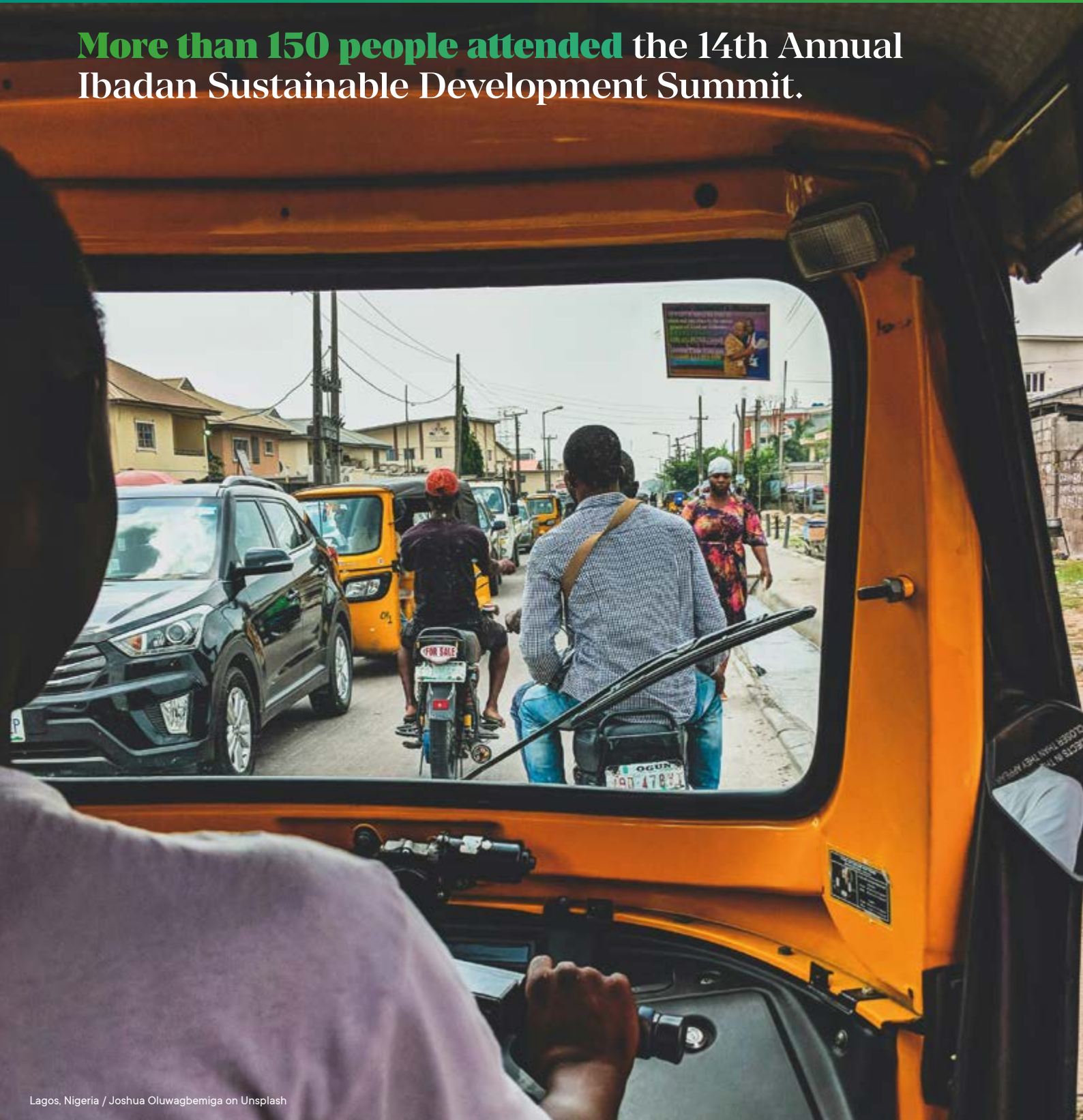

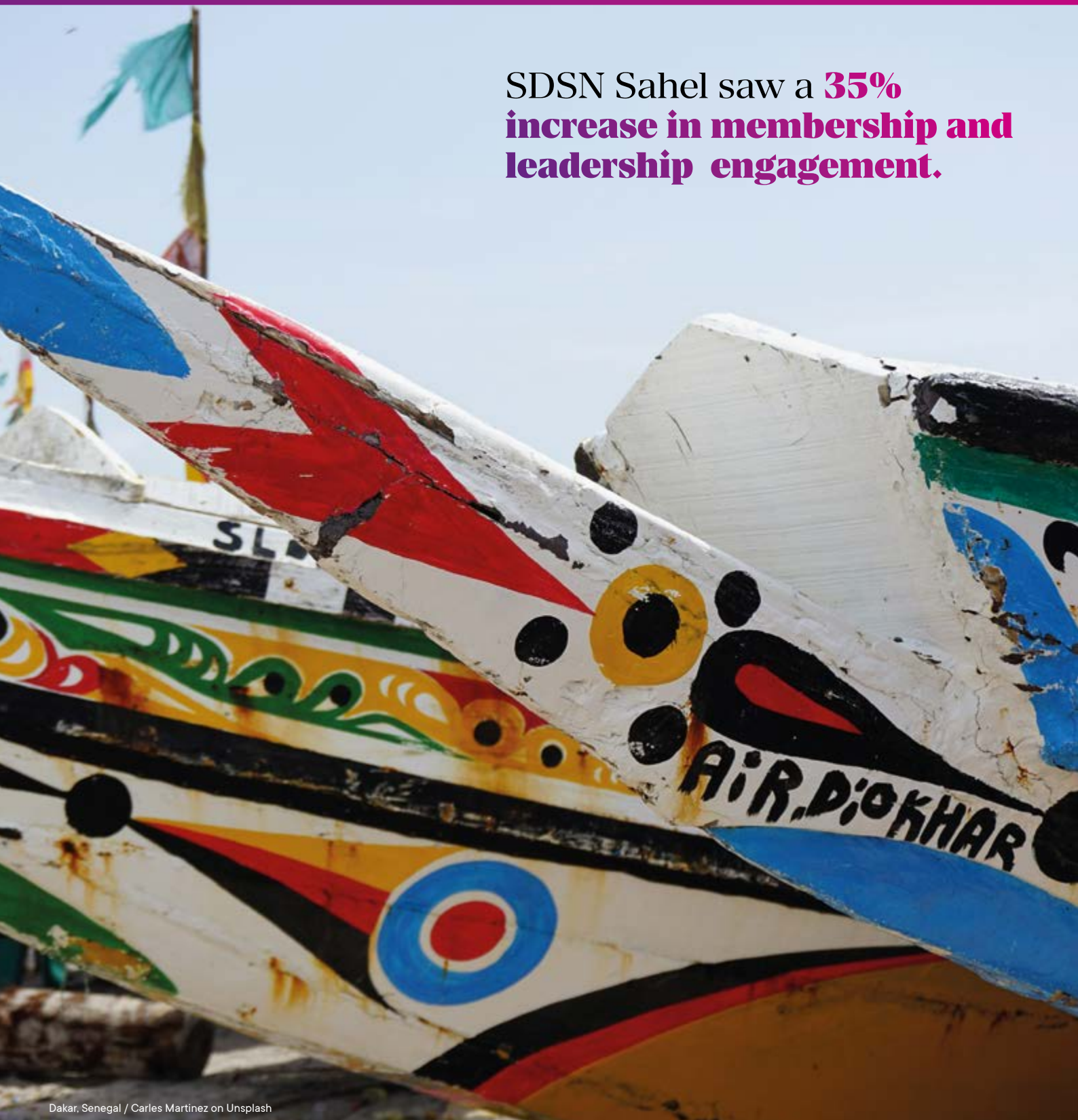

ENGAGEMENT WITH KNOWLEDGE INSTITUTIONS

In partnership with FAO, Makerere University is supporting climate change knowledge management. Its aim is to build the capacity of Uganda's Ministry of Agriculture, Animal Industry (MAAIF), Ministry of Water and Environment (MWE) and 19 district local governments to generate and disseminate information and knowledge on climate risks and emerging adaptation options, as well as sharing best practices at district and national levels. It has developed the Climate Change Adaptation Knowledge Base (CCAKB) and established Knowledge Management and Communication Team (KMCTs) in 19 districts, and trained over 100 participants in knowledge management.



SDG LOCALIZATION

SDSN Uganda works closely with the SDGs Secretariat of the Uganda government, hosted in the office of the Prime Minister. The network participates in the SDG Coordination meetings and supports the government's Voluntary National Review (VNR) stakeholder engagement processes.

SDSN Uganda supports the incorporation of the SDGs in teaching, learning and research in network universities. SDSN Uganda is preparing the Makerere University Sustainable Development Report (SDR) 2024 to document sustainability in teaching and learning, and the university's contribution to achieving the SDGs.



FOCUS ON SDG 3 AND SDG 13

SDSN Uganda also focuses on SDG 3 (Good health and well-being), and SDG 13 (Climate Action). In collaboration with the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, and Makerere University School of Public Health, SDSN Uganda is implementing a research project titled "Building Partnerships for Resilience: strengthening responses to health shocks from the grassroots," aimed at developing and strengthening international partnerships to conduct research to inform policy and practice that improves effective community-led responses to public-health crises.

POLICY ADVOCACY

The “Beating Amazon: Communal and Voluntary Conservation Network” meeting held in the regions of Loreto and Ucayali, Peru in August 2023, focused on strengthening partnerships among Network Members, while stimulating debates and joint actions on sustainable development. One of those actions, the “Amazon Without Borders: Contributions from Civil Society and Local Communities in the Pan-Amazon region to the Amazon Summit” program, resulted in increased participation and political influence by civil society and indigenous and other traditional groups across the region.



POLICY ADVOCACY

In preparation for the Amazon Summit, SDSN Amazônia organized free, virtual plenary sessions as part of the “Amazon Dialogues” series organized by the Brazilian General-Secretariat of the Presidency, regarding socio-environmental issues and the role of traditional communities in the region. Sessions included the “Pre-Summit of Forest Peoples and Civil Society of the Pan-Amazon” and “Brazil represented at the Amazon Summit” held at the network’s headquarters.

POLICY ADVOCACY

In August 2023, SDSN Amazônia presented a letter to the Presidents of the Amazon Cooperation Treaty Organization (ACTO) member countries at the Amazon Summit, held in Belém, Brazil. The letter, written by representatives of civil society organizations from the ACTO member countries, shared socio-environmental recommendations and solutions for the region, as well as a roadmap to COP30 which will be held in Belém, Brazil in 2025.

SOLUTIONS INITIATIVE, INCLUDING THE GLOBAL SOLUTIONS FORUM

In November 2022, Bolivia hosted its inaugural Solutions Forum, dedicated to Sustainable Tourism Solutions. This event, supported by 11 institutions, including SDSN Spain, showcased 21 unique proposals. From this selection, three outstanding initiatives were recognized:

First Place: ""La Región"" - A digital platform dedicated to promoting ecotourism and community-based tourism.

Second Place: ""Turismo El Alto"" - Specializing in nature-based tourism, specifically catering to local communities and students.

Third Place: ""Colibrí Ecolodge"" - Proposed to replicate its successful lodging business model in different communities across the nation.

54 tourism companies received Business Advisory Services from the Bolivian Observatory for a Sustainable Tourism Industry (ORBITA).

POLICY ADVOCACY

SDSN Bolivia has solidified its role as a key promoter of tourism as an engine for sustainable development in Bolivia. Specifically, it provided support to 25 student theses researching the connections between tourism, sustainable development, and women's economic empowerment, developed the Municipal Index of Tourism Potential (IMPT), and published 15 Tourism Intelligence Bulletins (BIT). Additionally, the network provided Business Advisory Services to 54 tourism companies, supported four community-based tourism initiatives in rural areas, and provided training in responsible adventure tourism to 50 tour guides.

The Guide provides a reference point on how post-secondary institutions in Canada and around the world are reporting their progress on the SDGs, with the aim of accelerating SDGs reporting, commitments, and action by Canada’s universities and colleges.



EDUCATION FOR THE SDGs

SDSN Canada launched the “Youth Leadership Certificate for the SDGs” program in 2023, an online program that supports university and college students across the country to develop the expertise and skills to take action on the SDGs. Over the course of three months, participating students completed one online self-paced course offered by the SDG Academy, as well as attended up to six online skill-building workshops every two weeks with a variety of Canadian partner organizations.

SDSN Canada hosted the fifth iteration of the Together|Ensemble conference, Canada’s national all-of-society gathering on the SDGs. The 2023 conference featured three full days of in-person and online programming showcasing SDG work across Canada, with a focus on how to accelerate the country’s progress and what needs to be done differently to achieve the SDGs.

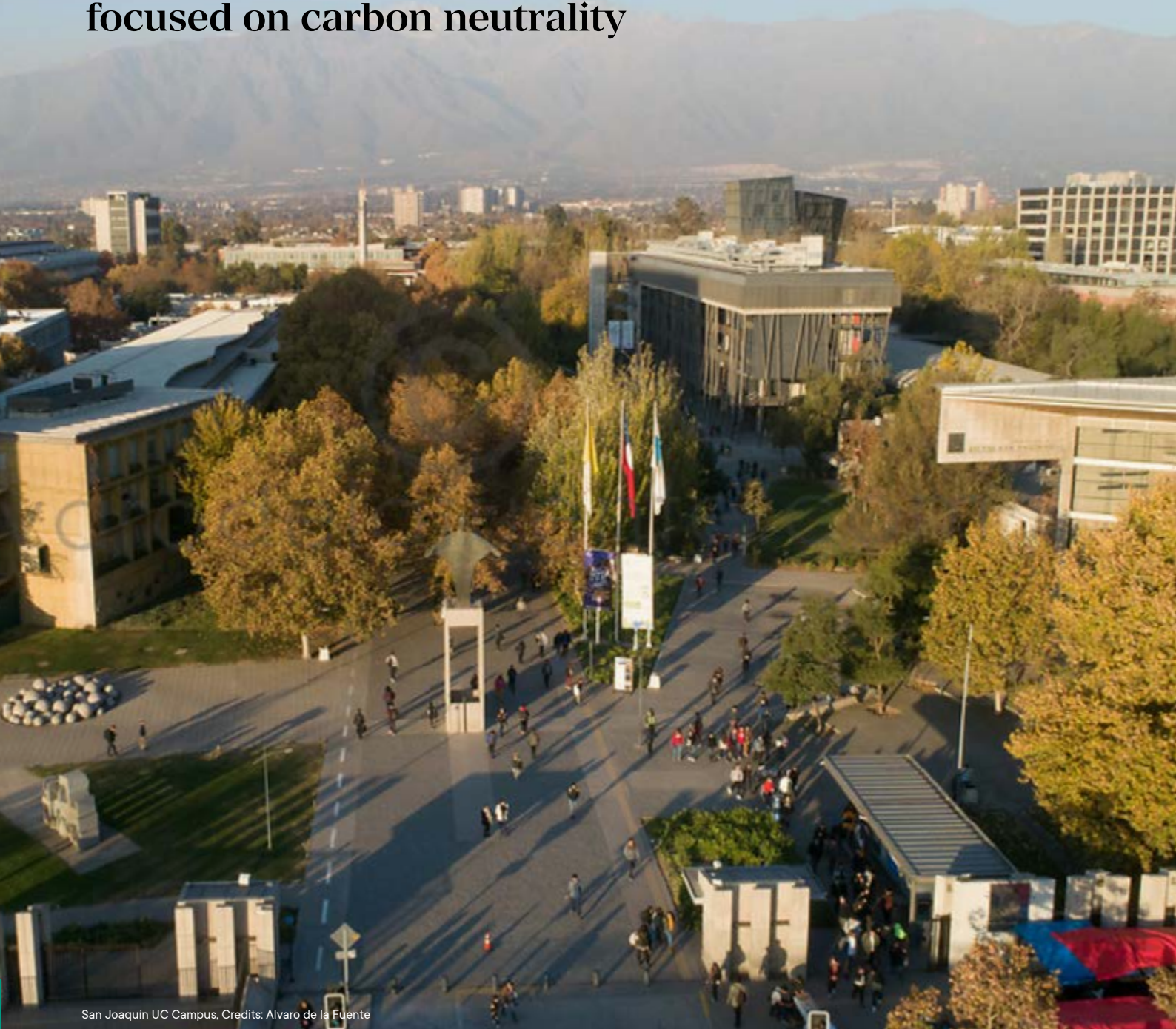

ENGAGEMENT WITH KNOWLEDGE INSTITUTIONS

In June 2023, SDSN Mexico held its first in-person members' meeting since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. The two-day meeting allowed members to share experiences, best practices and lessons learned over the past two years; as well as participate in workshops and networking sessions.



SDG LOCALIZATION

POLICY ADVOCACY

In this regard, the network strengthened its collaboration with the Federal Government and the Secretariat of the 2030 Agenda, which resulted in its participation at the 1st National Convention on the 2030 Agenda in Mexico where it presented its main achievements and initiatives.

SDSN USA and the Climate and Energy Program began working with the City of Cleveland's Mayor's Office of Sustainability and Climate Justice on a workshop focused on bringing together city council members and high-level stakeholders for training, information sharing, and discussion of needs and barriers to decarbonizing the City of Cleveland. YOUTH

In July 2023, SDSN Australia, New Zealand, & Pacific - Youth launched Towards an AusNZPac Youth SDG Index, a youth-led report that was the first in the world to use the SDGs framework to measure young people's progress towards sustainable development, and highlighted the need for a more genuine SDGs youth focus.



SDG LOCALIZATION

To mark the mid-point of Agenda 2030, the network collaborated with the UN Global Compact Network Australia on two cross-sector workshops in October 2023 to discuss Australia's SDG progress and identify concrete opportunities for accelerating action. The network also co-hosted a public lecture in Melbourne by SDSN President Prof. Jeffrey Sachs on Leadership for Sustainable Development.



YOUTH

Together with Monash Sustainable Development Institute (MSDI) and UNICEF Australia, SDSN Australia, New Zealand, & Pacific - Youth supported the 2023 Australian Local Conference of Youth (LCOY). The LCOY involved consultation workshops to empower young people to address climate change and to produce the 2023 National Child and Youth Statement on Climate Change, the official Australian youth input to COP28.



EDUCATION FOR THE SDGs

Continuing the Accelerating SDG Practice Initiative, in 2022 SDSN Australia, New Zealand & Pacific co-organized with Australasian Campuses Towards Sustainability (ACTS) and Principles for Responsible Management Education (PRME) Australia nine virtual sessions to share good practices, challenges and opportunities for mainstreaming education in higher education in the region.

LCOY consulted almost 200 young people across Australia, both in person and online.

SDG LOCALIZATION

To drive SDG localization in China, TUSDG worked with BRI International Green Development Coalition and other global partners on 'Research on BRI Green Development Outlook' evaluating the green development among 139 BRI countries, which was selected by the 3rd BRI Forum for International Cooperation High-level Forum on Green Development as a case of multilateral cooperation.

TUSDG organized two global competitions attracting **371 students from 120 universities resulting in 99 SDGs-related solutions.**



SOLUTIONS INITIATIVE

SDSN China Hub's host institution, TUSDG, organized the national level version of SDSN's Universities for SDG 13 Award Competition. The finalist, which was also selected for the global level competition, was a project titled Reducing Carbon with Carbon by students from Shanghai Jiao Tong University. The solution addressed the issue of graphite waste from lithium batteries and proposes the deployment of graphene-like nanomaterials from spent graphite for carbon reduction, thus changing the original traditional treatment method of incineration, and providing a pollution-free, low-cost, and sustainable method.

ENGAGEMENT WITH KNOWLEDGE INSTITUTIONS

SDSN Indonesia addressed knowledge gaps among non-state actors by hosting a workshop entitled “The Role of University and Civil Society Organizations” that connected academia and civil society with government-offered SDG mechanisms. YOUTH

In collaboration with SDSN Youth Indonesia, SDSN Indonesia hosted a national competition for solutions under the youth track of the Solutions Forum. Held online on October 28, 2023, the competition saw the submission of 12 solutions from youth communities and organizations. Among the outstanding entries, five finalists were selected, showcasing innovative approaches to address various societal challenges. Notably, the winning solution emerged from the Indonesian Women League, titled ‘Ladies Circle,’ a program designed to empower young women.



SOLUTIONS INITIATIVE

SDSN Indonesia participated in the inaugural Asia-Pacific Solutions Forum hosted by SDSN in Sunway City, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. Of the six solutions which were selected to present, the solution endorsed by SDSN Indonesia was PARCIS. PARCIS, which stands for Portable Archimedes Screw, is a portable mini-hydro power plant designed as an accelerator for the transition and decentralization of clean and renewable energy. This initiative proposes a solution to generate clean energy, particularly in high-elevation regions.

The xSDG Lab at Keio University led by SDSN Japan Chair, Prof. Norichika Kanie in collaboration with ESRI Japan and Kokusai Kogyo Co., Ltd., developed “SDGs Today Japan,” a platform to visualize the progress of local governments, companies, and organizations in promoting the SDGs in Japan. It utilizes GIS for regional visualization, offering a hub site with content on SDGs achievements and initiatives. Released in June 2023, the platform plans to expand its content and collaborations to accelerate societal transformations towards SDGs by effectively utilizing GIS.

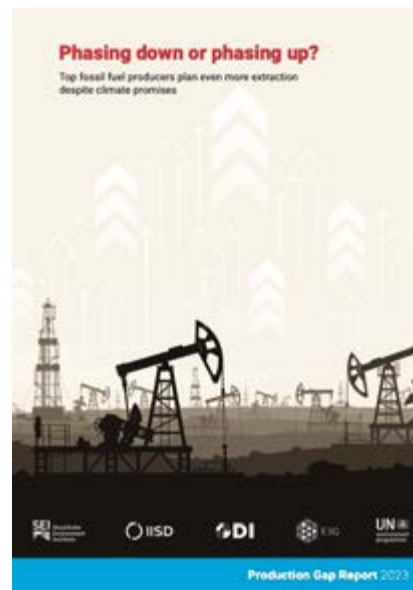
SDSN researchers Serik Orazgaliyev and Aliya Sembayeva contributed to the 4th Production Gap Report published by the UNEP and SEI, which tracks the discrepancy between governments' planned fossil fuel production and global production levels consistent with limiting warming to 1.5°C or 2°C. Particularly, they provided input to Kazakhstan's country profile, evaluating governments' latest climate ambitions and their plans, policies, and strategies that support fossil fuel production or the transition away from it. The report was widely discussed in reputable media outlets such as the New York Times, Wall Street Journal, and Guardian.

SDSN Kazakhstan provided chapter contributions to **three books, published two policy briefs and a number of articles in the media.**



SDG LOCALIZATION

SDSN Kazakhstan hosted its annual large-scale thematic conferences on the SDGs. The first was held in May 2023, and covered three research priority areas of SDSN Kazakhstan: 1) Land, Water, and Communities; 2) Energy and Climate; 3) Education and Partnerships. It brought 350 participants from academia to government, to non-profit organizations and broader civil society. In 2024, the 2nd annual conference on 'Localization of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) across sectors in Central Asia' will take place, where challenges in SDG localization and implementation both at national and subnational levels across a variety of sectors will be discussed.

YOUTH

SDSN Korea fosters 4,000+ SDSN Youth Korea activists annually in 37 universities across the country. They form an SDGs ecosystem through 17 regional SDG Youth Committees. SDSN Korea holds a General Assembly twice a year, to enable 80 youth leaders and the private and public sectors and academic institutions to pursue collaborative projects.

SDG LOCALIZATION

Since 2020, SDSN Korea has conducted the SDG Youth Hackathon & Living Lab in collaboration with the Seoul Metropolitan Government and several Local Governments to diagnose the problems and potential of the local community and discover solutions based on the SDGs. One such solution was the OeSeongGong, which published traditional fairy tale books in nine languages and donated them to local libraries.

SDSN Korea achieved matchmaking between **108 youth leaders** and field experts to enable innovative project creation.



POLICY ADVOCACY

SDSN Korea in partnership with the central government, local governments, corporations, CSOs, academic societies, universities, and youth, adopted the Framework Act Law (FAL) on Sustainable Development. The FAL is the highest level of legal code for organizations in South Korea.



EDUCATION FOR THE SDGs

SDSN Korea developed GT(Glocalcitizenship Training), a Korean UNESCO ESD Official Project, and trains SDSN Youth Korea. Since 2019, SDSN Korea has offered 56 lectures. GT consists of the Activist-Leadership-Innovator Course, and as of January 2024, 1,433 youth activists have graduated.

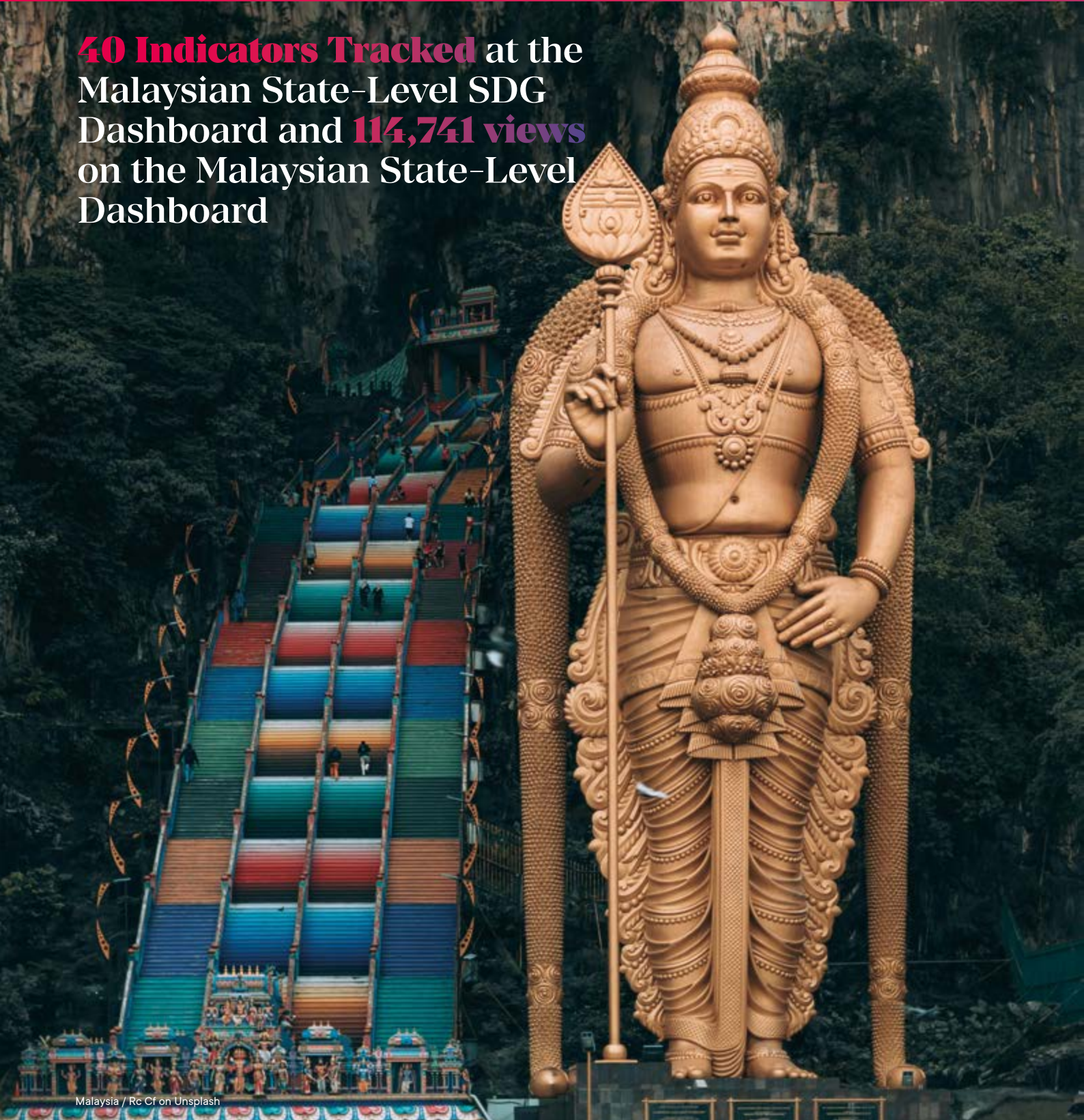

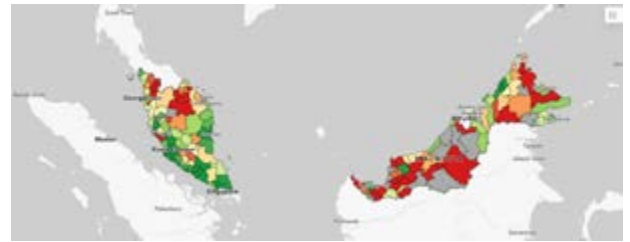


YOUTH

SDSN Malaysia convened a group of youth leaders from Sunway University to implement SDG-related projects. SDSN Malaysia Youth’s main solutions-building effort focuses on SDG 3: Good Health and Wellbeing, particularly the indicator on promoting mental wellbeing. In 2022, a participatory public art experience Wall of Kindness initiative received over 240 handwritten notes. 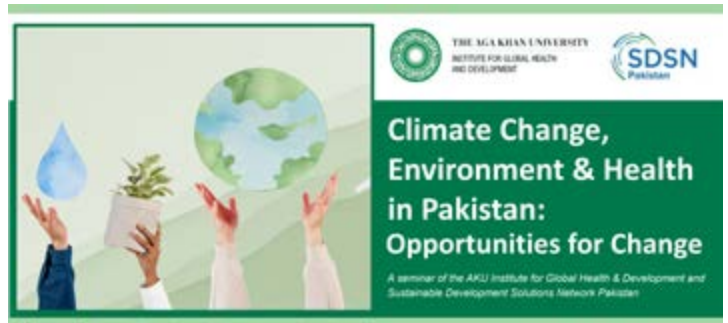

Three university teams were selected to receive seed funds to implement small scale SDG localization initiatives. In 2024, SDSN Thailand aims to expand the number of universities to include more youth leaders who will be trained and supported to create their own SDG youth groups/networks in their local communities.



POLICY ADVOCACY

TRANSFORMATION PATHWAYS

From June 27 to 30, 2023, the 28th Annual Conference of the European Association of Environmental and Resource Economists took place in Limassol. EDUCATION FOR THE SDGs

In collaboration with partners from the IMPETUS project, SDSN Europe is leading the development of a Massive Online Open Course on innovative climate adaptation solutions in Europe (forthcoming in the summer of 2024 on the SDG Academy's edX platform). Professor Phoebe Koundouri, co-Chair of SDSN Europe, is the lead faculty of the course. SDSN Europe is also developing two online courses for SMEs and students as part of the CATALYST project. These courses, to be launched in the autumn of 2024, are designed to equip individuals with the knowledge of the Agenda 2030 and the SDGs, and tools necessary for effective SDGs implementation in various contexts.

SDG LOCALIZATION

SDSN Europe has made significant contributions to SDG localization through three key reports. Firstly, SDSN Europe contributed to the 2023/24 Europe Sustainable Development Report, with wide support from European SDSN networks and member institutions. Secondly, the SDSN Senior Working Group on the European Green Deal launched its third report titled "Transforming Our World: Interdisciplinary Insights on the Sustainable Development Goals", delving into the multifaceted nature of sustainable development and offering insights to guide policy decisions. Lastly, SDSN Europe produced a report for the World Health Organization titled "Progress in the WHO European Region towards the SDGs in the context of the Ostrava Declaration on Environment and Health: mid-way to 2030".



ENGAGEMENT WITH KNOWLEDGE INSTITUTIONS

The ICSD side-event "Think Globally, Act Systemically: Driving Sustainable Change at the UN SDG Summit" convened actors from a range of disciplines to address global challenges in a holistic manner. It highlighted the importance of systems thinking in catalyzing significant shifts towards sustainability. Participants brought perspectives from European projects and initiatives on climate resilience, health and net-zero cities.

The High-Level Political Forum (HLPF) side-event on "Developing Systemic Solutions for Climate Adaptation and Mitigation Through Multi Stakeholder Approaches" promoted dialogue on systemic solutions for climate adaptation and mitigation. This collaboration among scientists, local authorities, and communities emphasized the need for integrated approaches and shared expertise to address global sustainability challenges.

POLICY ADVOCACY

In April 2023, SDSN Europe partnered with the European Economic and Social Committee (EESC) for a joint workshop in Brussels titled "How to strengthen the EU's leadership on the SDGs". With over 600 participants, the workshop centered discussions on accelerating SDG progress in the EU and globally. In preparation for the 2023 UN HLPF, the workshop explored European SDG diplomacy and strategies to mitigate negative international spillovers, as well as showcased systemic solutions developed by leading European projects.

Additionally, upon the invitation of the Spanish Presidency, SDSN Europe supported the EESC in issuing an opinion "EU and Agenda 2030: Strengthening SDG Implementation", adopted on October 25, 2023. The opinion reiterated the necessity for an integrated, ambitious strategy aligning with long-term goals to expedite SDG progress at both European and global levels.

PARTICIPATION IN SDSN INITIATIVES

SDSN Greece joined the FABLE Consortium in June 2023 and participates with a team of researchers from the Alliance of Excellence for Research and Innovation on ephoria (AE4RIA) chaired by Prof. Koundouri. The FABLE team in Greece uses the FABLE calculator to provide projections for the country's performance in Sustainable Agriculture, Energy, Food Security and Biodiversity for the 2020–2050 period. The process is embodied in the global projections of the FABLE consortium through the Scenathons process and will culminate in a detailed country report in 2024.



TRANSFORMATION PATHWAYS

The Global Climate Hub was launched in July 2023 as an SDSN Thematic Network, with the mission of providing science-based recommendations for combating the climate crisis and preventing further deterioration. It includes expertise from SDSN members under Prof. Koundouri's leadership, co-chair of SDSN Greece. The GCH is hosted by AUEB and the Athena Research & Innovation Center while the Academy of Athens and the Technical University of Denmark are two of the most important co-founding institutions. At COP 28, the GCH launched a report to present its work on net zero pathways.



EDUCATION FOR THE SDGs

Both host institutions of SDSN Greece have run several ESG (Environmental, Social and Corporate Governance) professional courses, including one titled "ESG, SDGs and Sustainable Finance," in collaboration with PwC Greece, and one on ESG Instruments & Strategy, in collaboration with the Global Compact Greece. The co-chairs of the network, Prof. Koundouri and Prof. Papandreou, are also the scientific directors of the courses held at AUEB and PESD respectively.



FOCUS ON SDG 4 AND SDG 13

SDSN Greece focused on SDG 13. AUEB and Athena RC currently participate in 12 EU funded international research projects on sustainable pathways, climate neutrality and resilience.

SDSN Greece also focused on SDG 4. PESD currently leads the Erasmus Project SDGs for Universities. SDG4U fosters the implementation of SDGs in higher education by embedding them across teaching, research, operations, and community outreach.

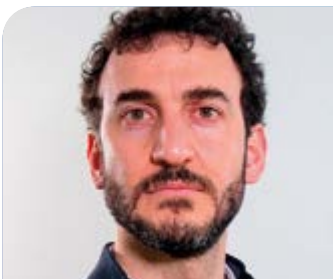
SDG LOCALIZATION

SOLUTIONS INITIATIVE

The SDG Impact Assessment Tool has been available in English since 2019. To allow more people to use the tool, the SDSN Northern Europe secretariat organized a project that made the tool available in seven languages. 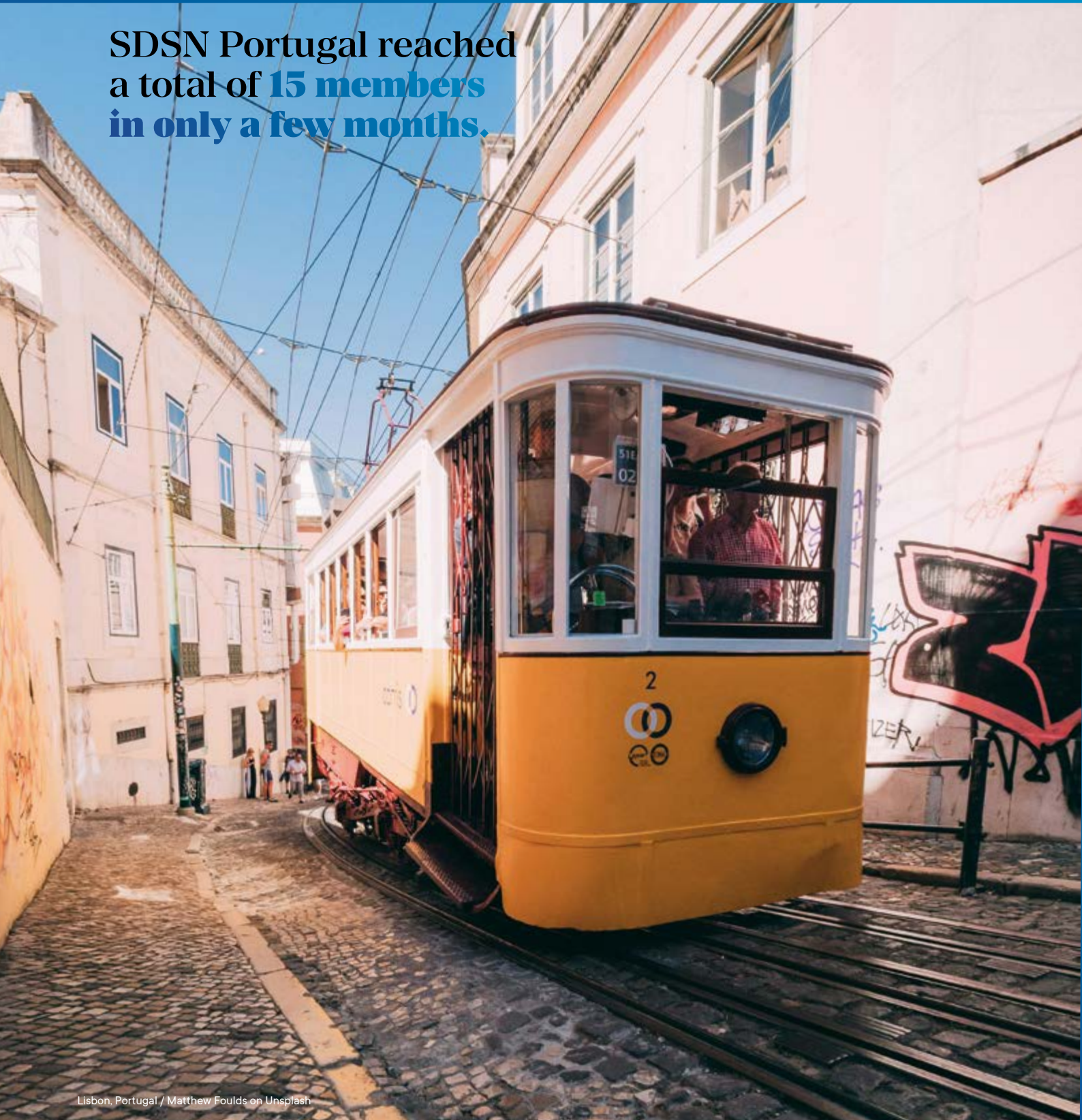

POLICY ADVOCACY

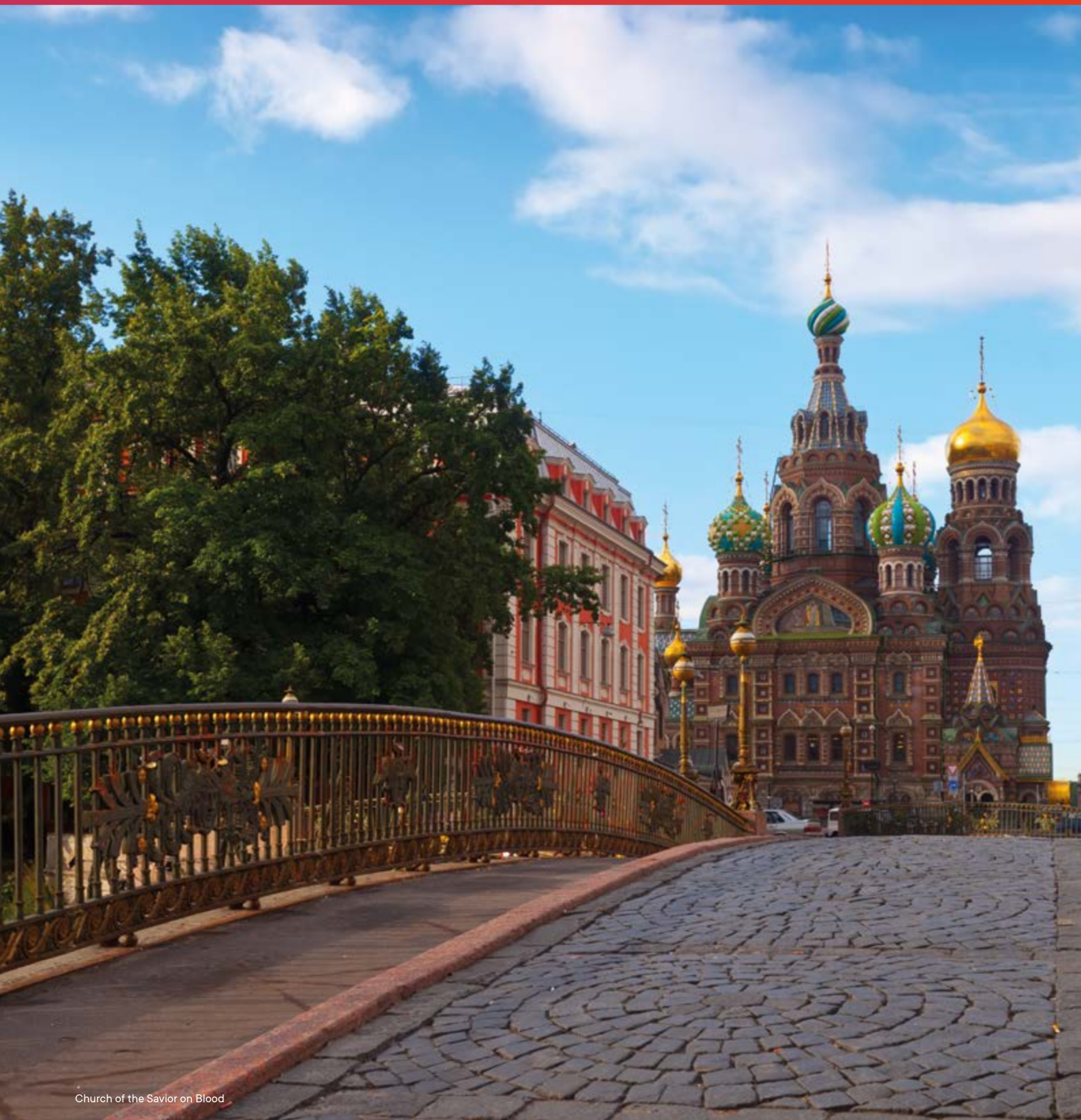

PARTICIPATION IN SDSN INITIATIVES

The host institution of SDSN Russia, RANEPА, localized the SDG Index for Russian cities with a population of over 500 thousand. For 37 cities, 60 indicators were calculated for 15 SDGs, covering the period of 2010–2020/2021. The southern cities obtained higher rankings due to their higher levels of income and cleaner environments.

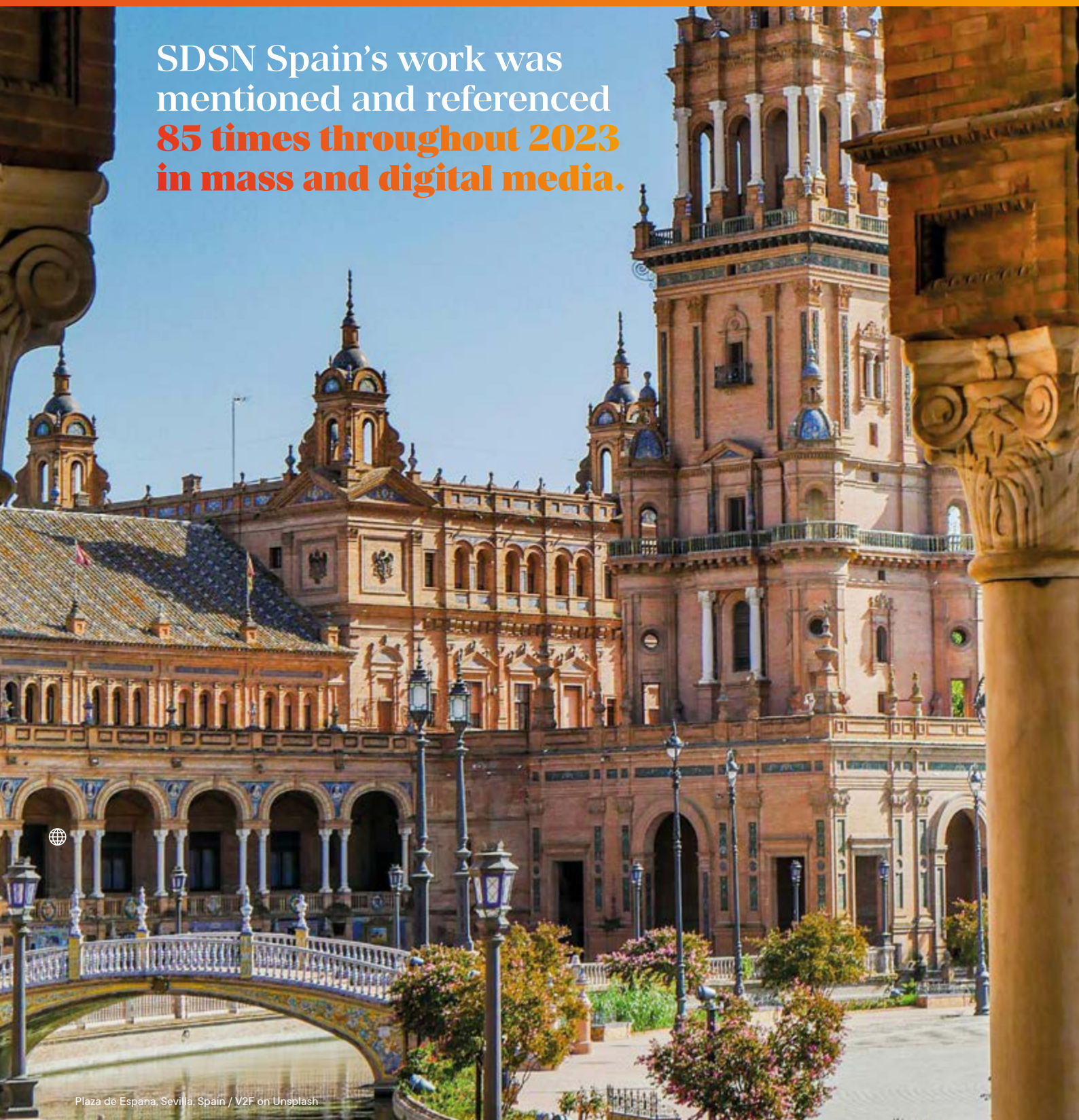

FOCUS ON SDG 11, SDG 13, AND SDG 17

SDSN Spain worked with the cultural sector to host five multistakeholder dialogues in various Spanish cities, involving over 150 participants. The conclusions from these discussions have been compiled into a document that details the process and presents the opinions of representatives from the Spanish cultural sector on how to enhance the visibility and impact of culture in SDG progress reports.



ENGAGEMENT WITH KNOWLEDGE INSTITUTIONS

SDSN Spain fosters collaboration between universities and local governments, addressing sustainable development challenges. Through the Unicityies 2023 initiative, two pilot cities (Valencia and Vitoria) are linking master students' academic work to urban transformation needs, thus engaging municipal policy officers and the University of the Basque Country, the Technical University of Valencia, and the University of Valencia. Moreover, an internship program at the University of Zaragoza involved students in the fight against depopulation in the rural town of Urriés.

POLICY ADVOCACY

More than 300 participants attended the first national Food System Summit organized by SDSN Switzerland. The Federal Councillor, Guy Parmelin, and Bernard Lehmann of the United Nations' High Level Panel of Experts on Food Security and Nutrition (HLPE) provided inputs for the Summit. Representatives from the entire value chain and from all major political parties took part in panel discussions.

TRANSFORMATION PATHWAYS

In a detailed guidelines document, the scientific committee of Food Future Switzerland, initiated by SDSN Switzerland, put forth a Pathway for Transforming the Swiss Food System to align with the 2030 Agenda. Within this framework, the committee suggested a set of specific actions. Rather than treating these actions in isolation, they were strategically interconnected and arranged in a well-organized chronological sequence.



FOCUS ON SDG 8 AND SDG 12

SDSN Switzerland launched a new project in partnership with the Institute for Economy and the Environment at the University of St. Gallen. The aim is to promote a regenerative economy, i.e. business models that contribute to the restoration of ecological, social, and economic resources. In this project, regenerative business models will be identified and tools will be developed to help companies move towards a future within planetary boundaries.

EDUCATION FOR THE SDGs

SDSN Türkiye is focused on SDG 4, promoting Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) as well as supporting the work of the SDG Academy and the Global Schools Initiative. The network collaborates with UNESCO and the Ministry of National Education of Türkiye on ESD, Climate Education, and Action for Climate Empowerment. The network has organized several educational programs around the SDGs for K-12 school teachers (including vocational ones) and students aged 6 to 25, such as ‘Teachers 2030: Mobilization for SDGs and Climate Action’ with the support of Schneider Electric. Finally, the network translated UNESCO’s ESD Goals Learning Objectives, ESD for 2030 Roadmap and SDG Academy course ‘How to Achieve the SDGs’.



POLICY ADVOCACY

SDSN Türkiye advocates for climate education and the transition to a low-carbon economy. In that sense, the Network organized a workshop at the UN’s Conference of Parties (COP28) in Dubai on the Role of Universities on Decarbonization. As an active policy entrepreneur, SDSN Türkiye presented its activities on Action for Climate Empowerment (ACE), education, and advocacy to mobilize universities, government, ministries, and NGOs for the transition to a low-carbon and circular economy during the year. SDSN Türkiye elaborated on its initiatives fostering collaboration in the region and presented SDSN’s Net Zero on Campus initiative at COP28 and in various activities.



SDG LOCALIZATION

SDSN Türkiye organized conferences on the ‘Triple Transformations’ and ‘Sustainable Tourism’ for the localization of the SDGs convening government, the private sector, NGOs and academia. The network organized various events and programs around different SDGs, and developed training material and e-learning content for different sectors. It participated in various conferences to present SDSN activities and expand SDSN Türkiye’s impact. Leveraging SDSN’s global Sustainable Development Report, the network mobilized institutions and society to accelerate the achievement of the SDGs. The 2023 SDR was widely disseminated thanks to the network’s active participation on TV and other media channels, as well as through their written contributions in sustainability magazines.



PARTICIPATION IN SDSN INITIATIVES

SDSN Türkiye carried out consultations on green and digital transformation for various sectors, based on the Sustainable Development Report and the SDG Index. The network also organized an event on the Happiness Report 2022 with experts from Columbia University. SDSN Türkiye participated in ICSD 2023 with its research titled ‘Exploring Teachers’ Reflections on the Sustainable Development Goals and Climate Change Teacher Training Program.’

SDSN UK was successful in a small grant application for the 'SDG data gaps in the UK' project, a joint impact-oriented research project with Newcastle University, enriched through the collaboration with the Office for National Statistics (ONS), which aims to propose solutions and recommendations for improvement to current SDG data practices. Upcoming project outputs include a research paper written in collaboration with practitioners from the ONS and a policy brief.



POLICY ADVOCACY

In July 2023, SDSN UK co-organized an official HLPF side event with SDSN Germany and a number of other partners. Titled "Spillover effects, sustainable supply chains and SDG 9," the event focused on negative spillover effects and the challenges faced by governments, companies and other social actors in designing sustainable supply chains.
